

# **Prosigns – Procedural Signals**

- <AA> "New Line / End-of-line" Add A line didahdidah
- <AAA>/<.> "Full-stop" didahdidahdidah
- <AR>/<+> "End-of-Message, New Page" All Rendered didahdidahdit
- <AS> "Wait / Stand-by" A Sec didahdididi
  - BK "Back-to-you" BreaK dahdididit dahdidah
- <BT>/<=> "Pause / New Paragraph" Break for Text dahdidididah
  - **C** "Correct, yes" dahdidahdi
  - CL "Going of the air (Clear)" Closing Station dahdidahdit didahdidit
- <CT> "Attention" Copy This dahdidahdidah
  - CQ "Calling any station" dahdidahdi dahdahdidah
  - **DE** *"This / From"* dahdidi di
- - K "Over, Any station can transmit" OK go ahead dahdidah
  - **KA** *"Beginning of message"* dahdidah didah
- **<KN>** "Over to you only" **OK N**amed "station can transmit" dahdidahdahdit
  - N "No / Negative" dahdi
- <NJ>/<DO> "Change to Wabun code" Next Japanese dahdididahdahdah
- <NR> NumbeR Follows dahdididahdi
  - **OP** *"OPerator"* dahdahdah didahdahdi
  - **R** "All Received / Roger" didahdi
  - **RST** *"Readability-Signal Strength-Tone 599"* didahdi dididi dah
- <SK> "End of Contact / Out / Clear" Silencing Key didididahdidah
- <SN>/VE "HaVE Understood" Sure Nuff dididahdit
- <\$0\$ "Distress Signal" Save Our Souls dididahdahdahdididit
  - **73** "Best Regards" / **83** "Love and Kisses"

## **Q** Signals

**QRG? What is my frequency? QSD?** Is my Tx mutilated? QSG? Shall I send x? messages? **QRH?** Does my frequency vary? **QRI? How is my Tx tone? QSK?** Can I break in? **QRK?** How's my signal? QSL? Can you ack receipt? **QSM? Shall I repeat message? QRL? Are you busy? QRM?** Is my Tx interference? QSN? Do you hear me on X khz? **QRN?** Is there static? QSO? Can you talk to X? **QSP? Will you relay to X? QRO? Shall I increase power? QRP? Shall I decrease power?** QST CQ ARRL (Message) **QRQ? Shall I send faster?** QSU? Shall I reply on X freq? **QRS? Shall I send slower?** QSV? Shall I send Vs on X freq? **QSW? Will you send on X freq? QRT? Shall I stop sending? QRU?** Have you smthng for me? **QSX?** Will you listen on X freq? **QRV?** Are you ready? QSY? Shall I go to X freq? **QSZ? Shall I repeat words/sent? QRW? Shall I inform X of Y? QTA? Cancel message number? QRX? When will you call me? QRY? What is my turn? QTB?** Is my word count correct? **QTC? How many messages? QRZ? Who is calling me? QSA? What is my Tx strength? QTH? What is your location?** QTR? What is the correct time? **QSB?** Is my Tx fading?

### X1AA: CQ CQ CQ DE X1AA X1AA K

Calling anyone (CQ), this is (DE) X1AA, over, go ahead anyone (K)

#### X2BB: X1AA DE X2BB X2BB <KN>

Calling X1AA, this is X2BB, back-to-you only. (<KN> means you are inviting *only* the named party to reply)

#### X1AA: X2BB DE X1AA = GA DR OM UR RST 599 HR = QTH TIMBUKTU = OP IS JOHN = HW? X2BB DE X1AA <KN>

We note here again, the "=" signs represent the <BT> prosigns as e.g. in single-line display computerized Morse readers. Good afternoon dear old man you are <u>RST</u> 599 here (Note - RST 599 means... Very readable (5), very strong signal (9), very good tone (9)) I'm located in Timbuktu (QTH) The operator is John How do you copy? Go ahead only X2BB.

#### X2BB: X1AA DE X2BB = TNX FB RPRT DR OM JOHN UR 558 = QTH HIMALAYA = NAME IS YETI = X1AA DE X2BB K

Thanks for the fine business report dear old man John. I read you 558. (<u>RST</u> 558 means - Very readable (5), adequate, low-strength signal (5), good tone (8)) I am in the Himalayas (QTH) My name is Yeti, go ahead anyone (K).

My name is yeti, go anead anyone (K).

(Note sending K alone as a prosign without the run together N invites other callers to break in).

#### X1AA: X2BB DE X1AA = OK TNX QSO DR YETI = 73 ES HPE CU AGN X2BB DE X1AA K

Okay, thanks (for this) conversation QSO) dear Yeti Best regards (73) <u>Phillips Code</u> and hope to see you again. Go ahead anyone.

#### X2BB: X1AA DE X2BB = R TU CUAGN 73 X1AA DE X2BB <SK>

Roger (R) thank you see you again best regards (73). Signing off (silencing key) .(<SK>)

#### X1AA: **E E**

This traditional Morse code idiom resembles the archaic English "pip pip".
